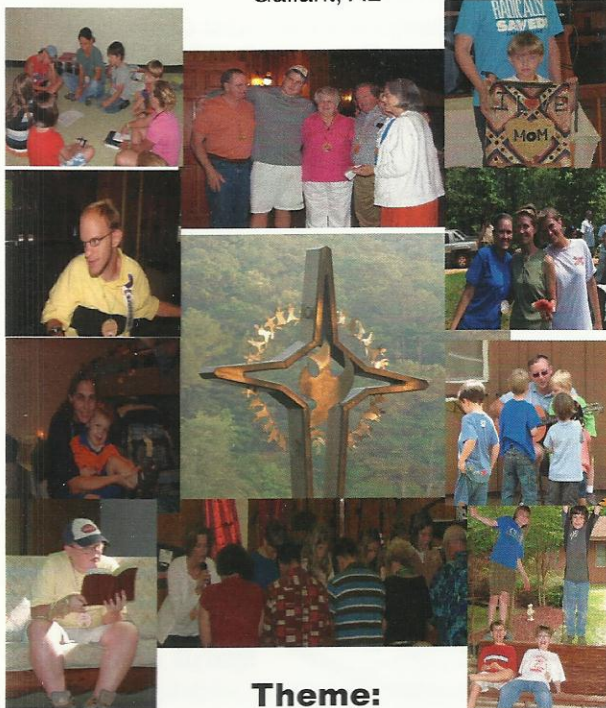

## What is CFO?

Camps Farthest Out are spiritual retreats under the leadership of Jesus Christ as Lord, Master, and Savior. They are held in various locations throughout the world. They are non-denominational, with campers and leaders from many churches and varied traditions. The emphasis is not on dogma or doctrine, but on a vital experience with God through Jesus Christ. Each CFO is lay-oriented and is open to all who hunger and thirst for a deeper relationship with Jesus. We stress the power and reality of prayer as a means of achieving this experience and the wholeness that it brings. CFO activities can be best characterized as spiritual training grounds, time apart from the routine of everyday life, and experiences in being immersed in His love. By yielding to the Holy Spirit, we seek to produce His fruit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. With this fruit in our lives, we find our fellowship with one another deepened and enriched with Jesus' love. After a week of renewal, we will be able to return to the everyday world and be a witness to the reality of Jesus' forgiving love and saving grace for all. We will be able to continue "discovering the wholeness of that abundant life which Christ promised." (Glenn Clark, founder of CFO).

## All ages welcome at Alabama CFO

## The CFO Program

### 24 hours a day in His presence:

Listening and participating, activity and quiet, ebb and flow, giving out and taking in

**Morning Meditations**--beginning each day sitting in His presence through a camper-led quiet time with God and devotional prayer

**Singing**--joining with one another in meaningful worship through Spirit-filled and joyful songs of praise and thanksgiving

**Morning and Evening Talks**--hearing from God through Biblical teaching as the speakers share from their personal experiences and spiritual walks with Jesus

**Rhythms (Devotion in Motion)**--exercising done devotionally, worshipping God with "all that is within me" (Psalm 103:1)--body, mind, and spirit

**Creatives**--listening to God and allowing Him to create through you using activities such as art, drama, writing, nature, banners, conversation and others--no skill is required, but a willingness to experiment is

**Prayer Groups**--discovering the power of prayer by praying--interceding for the camp, and ministering to one another

**Afterglow**--fellowshipping with others, forming friendships that often last a lifetime, winding down and reflecting with each other on what the Lord has done that day

## Accommodations

*The Lodge* features air-conditioned dormitory style rooms with 2 sets of bunk beds (4 beds in all), sink in the room, men's and women's bathrooms on the hall. The Lodge is most convenient to the dining room and meeting rooms. Linens, towels, and pillows are not furnished.

*The New Retreat Center* has motel-style rooms with 2 double beds, a private bathroom with shower, and individual A/C. Linens and towels are furnished. It is situated on a wooded hill across the road from the Lodge and meeting rooms. Meals for everyone are served cafeteria style in the Lodge dining room.

**Note: Building assignments will be given on a first-come first-served basis. Scholarship campers will be housed in the Lodge.**

*The terms Single, double, etc. refers to the cost per person age 11 and up and includes 3 meals a day (whether eaten or not). There is no cost for children age 4 and under. Up to 4 persons allowed per room.*

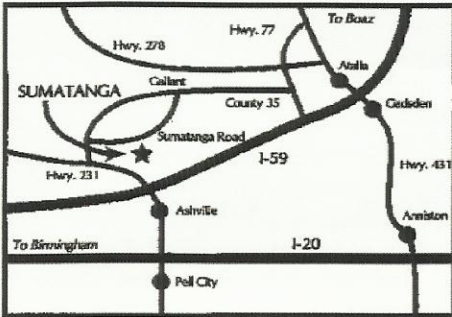
## Dates and Arrival Time

## How to get there:

Camp Sumatanga is located near Gallant, AL approximately 60 miles north of Birmingham in St. Clair County. When using I-59 take the Ashville-Oneonta exit on U.S. 231 North, drive towards Oneonta to county Hwy. 35, turn right and follow camp signs. From Oneonta, follow U.S. 231 South to foot of mountain; turn left on 35 and follow camp signs. Coming from Gadsden or Cullman, exit from U.S. 278 to AL 77, then to County road 35.
